- Conduct research to support the development of grant proposals
- Assist LFBS in the writing and submission of grant applications, proposals and reports
- Update and maintain database of funding opportunities
- Engage in other research, writing and reporting activities as required

Requirements

- Strong initiative, leadership, and problem solving skills
- Applicants must have reliable access to wifi
- A diploma or degree, or working toward a diploma or degree
- Strong interpersonal, writing, and communications skills in English
- Exceptional writing and editing skills
